BREED SHOW DIRECTIVES

These breed shows are open to all horses and all ponies (148 centimeters without shoes or 149 centimeters with shoes – 14 hand 2 ¼ inches). Ponies **MUST** have a halter on while being measured . Braiding is optional. If you do not have a current FEI measurement certificate, your pony must be measured by the judge and TD. Ponies will be measured at 7:30 am Wednesday and Thursday morning on the pavement between the end of Barn 7 and the Announcer's Booth.

Bridles are **mandatory** on 2 year olds and older horses. A bridle shall consist of a snaffle-type bit with two reins, a headstall with a throatlatch. A nose band is optional. A split or single chain may be used instead of reins. All horses (whether competing or non-competing) must wear bridle numbers at all times while being ridden, exercised or hand-walked.

- Handlers and Assistants must sign the entry form.
- Handlers are permitted to have one or two assistants. One to run behind the horse, one to hold another horse, the handler will run. Neither the assistant handler, nor the assistant holding a horse , may trot the horse, unless the horse is not being judged but accompanying a mare or a foal that is being judged. There can be no switching of handlers in a class.
- Appropriate sports attire **MUST** be worn by the handler and assistant.
- Handlers and/or assistant may each carry only one whip or one standard lunging whip without attachments.
- All foals must be under the control of a handler.
- **Prior to entering the competition arena, all handlers and assistants of horses in the competition ring are required to have on file, in the Show Secretary's office, a Handler/Assistant Release form, and MUST BE WEARING AN APPROPRIATE WRIST BAND.** The wristband will be put on each handler's and assistant's wrist by the Show Secretary.
- Handlers must be USEF members or pay a non-member fee. Assistant handlers are exempt from the non-member fee.
- Handlers with multiple entries must resolve scheduling conflicts. The Show Committee reserves the right to keep the show on schedule. **Each horse must have a separate handler, including noncompeting horses.**
- **If you are late for your class and the gate has closed, you will not be allowed in the ring.**
- The KDA Show Committee strongly encourages everyone to wear protective head gear when mounted.
- A judge must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger other exhibitors or their entries.
- All horses must have a stall.

There will be block scheduling for the IBC Classes. The classes with the fewest number of entries will go first. The "order of go" for the IBC classes will be published on Wednesday afternoon by the Show Secretary, Lori Kaminski. All times for the IBC classes will be posted at that time.

BREED SHOW DIRECTIVES

All entries must be typed or printed on the entry blank included in the prize list and must include:

- Photocopy of USEF proof of membership for owner, trainer, and rider and/or handler and coach (if applicable) **MUST** accompany entry form.
- Photocopies of Horses USDF ID number or lifetime registration and USEF ID number **MUST** accompany entry form.
- Photocopy of owner's USDF membership card.
- Please have original handwritten signatures – Owner, Trainer, Rider and/or Handler, and Assistant Handler.
- Please complete information on both sides of the entry form.
- Photocopy of current negative Coggins test.
- Check or money order made payable to the Kentucky Dressage Association.
- All fees to be in U. S. Funds. Returned checks incur a \$50 charge.
- If entering an IBC class, you must send appropriate documentation to verify association requirements. See pages 15 & 16 for a list of contacts for the individual associations.
- Please note that entries submitted without proper IBC class documentation are subject to an incomplete entry fee.

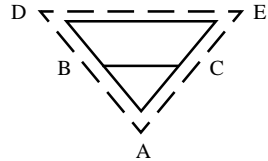

CLASS PROCEDURE – IN-HAND CLASSES

- Horses will be individually judged on a triangle. The triangle measures approximately 30 meters on each side.
- Highest scoring horses may be asked to return to the ring for a lineup and re-evaluation.
- When called by the Ringmaster, present horse to the judge at A for conformation judging. Proceed according to the diagram:

Stand horse at **A** for conformation judging
Walk small triangle **A-B-C-A**
Trot large triangle **A-D-E-A**

RIDER ELIGIBILITY - Competitors must have reached, or will reach, their 16th birthday in 2008 (ex. Junior Riders) and must be licensed by their national federation, and may only take part under the jurisdiction of the NF of the country from which they hold their passport. If not a U.S. citizen, they must be nominated by an invited foreign NF. Riders must be prepared to produce their license or USEF membership card on request of the Organizing Committee, and the name on the entry must be the same as appears on the license. U.S. riders in the CDI must present evidence of payment of IHP Dues or Fees. CDI/Y/J riders are exempt from payment of IHP Dues or Fees. *All riders must present evidence of FEI Rider Registration in order to participate.*

HORSE ELIGIBILITY - Horses must be a minimum of seven years of age (six years for the JR and YR tests) and must exceed 149 cm including shoes. Mares may not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or within nine months after foaling date. The nationality of a horse is that of its owner or of the country in which the company owning it is registered. *Horses must have a valid National Passport or FEI Passport. USEF will provide information on veterinary requirements for foreign horses entering the USA. Horses must be stabled on the grounds and may not leave during the event (commencing with the Veterinary Inspection and ending with the pinning of their final FEI class). Each horse will keep the same number throughout the event. It is compulsory for this number to be worn by the horse, competitor or handler at all times, when the horse is being handled, exercised or shown on the grounds so that it may be identified by the stewards. *The requirement to have an FEI passport is waived for CDI* or CDI/Y/J horses competing in their home country. STARTING ORDER - A drawing in accordance to FEI Article 425 will be conducted each day to determine the order of starting for each class. The draw for Friday's classes will immediately follow the Veterinary Inspection on Thursday in the show office. Drawings on Friday and Saturday will be held adjacent to the show office, times TBA.

A draw time cannot be changed. Once entered in a class, a rider may not withdraw, except as specified in the FEI Rules. FEI Rules provide for penalties for scratches without good cause.

FREESTYLES - A horse must earn a minimum score of 55% in the qualifying class, in order to be eligible to start in a Freestyle competition. A draw in groups of five for the order of starting in the Freestyle. A draw first within the group of riders placed 11th to 15th and then within the group of riders placed 6th to 10th and last the group of riders placed 1st to 5th. i.e. the five best rider/horse combinations will start last.

Junior Freestyle: This competition is limited to and compulsory for, a maximum of the 15 best rider/horse

combinations who qualified in the Junior Individual competition and who previously declared for the Freestyle. Riders may start one horse.

Young Rider Freestyle: This competition is limited to and compulsory for, a maximum of the 15 best rider/horse combinations who qualified in the Young Riders Prix St Georges competition and who previously declared for the Freestyle. Riders may start one horse.

Intermediaire Freestyle CDI:* Rider/horse combinations who qualified in the Intermediate I and/or Prix St Georges (Riders from PSG will be allowed to start in order to complete up to 15 starters if less riders have qualified from Intermediate I) competition and who previously declared for the Freestyle. Riders may start one horse.

TACK CHECK - A Steward will check the saddlery of each horse immediately after he leaves the competition arena. Any

discrepancy will entail immediate elimination. All exercise/warmup areas and arenas will be supervised.

INTERMEDIAIRE I MUSICAL FREESTYLE - Participation is limited to and compulsory for a maximum of *15 best rider/horse combinations who qualified in the Prix St. Georges or Intermediaire I competition and who earned a minimum of 55%. **A rider may start with only one horse. Participation is compulsory for riders who entered the class and qualified to ride.*

YOUNG RIDER MUSICAL FREESTYLE - Participation is limited to Young Riders and is optional and open to the six (minimum) to *15 (maximum) best horse/rider combinations from Class 106 (FEI Young Rider Prix St. Georges Test), who earned a minimum score of 55%. **A rider may start with only one horse. Participation is compulsory for riders who entered the class and qualified to ride.*

JUNIOR MUSICAL FREESTYLE - Participation is limited to Juniors and is optional and open to the six (minimum) to *15 (maximum) best horse/rider combinations from Class 107 (FEI Junior Individual Test), who earned a minimum score of 55%.

**A rider may start with only one horse. Participation is compulsory for riders who entered the class and qualified to ride.*

Important USEF Dressage Rules:

1. All horses **MUST** have a USEF ID number unless only competing in classes on the exception lists. They are free of charge from USEF. All horses must have a USDF HID# or a USDF Lifetime Registration.
2. You must have a USDF non-member identification card or fill out form for one, if you are not a USDF member.
3. Sound of the bell or whistle: National riders, you have 45 seconds to enter the ring after the bell or whistle sounds or you will be eliminated.
4. Sound of the bell: CDI*/CDIY/CDIJ riders should enter the arena at A as soon as possible. Exceeding 45 seconds before entering the arena after the bell has sounded will entail a penalty of 2 points per judge of 0.5% in Freestyle tests. The same applies to a competitor who enters the arena at A before the starting signal has been given. The Judge at C is responsible for bell and clock/time. A clock showing 45/60 sec. should be clearly visible for the rider.
5. Competition Numbers **MUST** be worn at all times when horse is out of the stall. **NON-compliance constitutes immediate ELIMINATION.**
6. There must be a separate competition number for each horse/rider and horse/handler combination.
7. Horses are limited to a maximum of three dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two dressage rides per day above Fourth Level.
8. Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels at any one competition.
9. Ring Stewards will watch for abuse. An adjustable-length whip **MAY NOT** be carried by a mounted rider.
10. Saddlery will be spot-checked in classes of 6 or more immediately after the horse leaves the ring. A new surgical glove will be used to bit check each horse.
11. Swan neck spurs are allowed. Roweled spurs must rotate.
12. Half chaps or leggings are not allowed.
13. Length of whip 110 cm or 43.3", includes the lash on the end.
14. Three competition errors equal elimination.
15. All horses on grounds must have saddlery and equipment suitable for competition.

Entries:

Each show entry must be postmarked by the closing date and **must include:**

- 1) Appropriate fees.
- 2) A copy of USEF & USDF cards for rider and owner. Trainer needs USEF card, owner may be USDF business member. If adult amateur, rider must provide copy of USEF AA card. If riding in a Great American Qualifying class, rider and owner must be participating members of USDF and also provide copies of current USDF cards, and provide copies of USDF Lifetime horse registration and USEF annual or life recording for the horse. **(THIS IS FOR EACH SHOW ENTERED)**. Please note that owners may be USDF Business Members per Gr. Amer/USDF Qualifying Classes.
- 3) A clearly legible copy of negative Coggins dated within 12 months of show date.**(FOR EACH SHOW ENTERED)**
- 4) Stabling requests - note names not a stable
- 5) All signatures (yes, on all lines!) **Note:** For entry purposes, “trainer” is defined as the adult on show grounds who will be responsible for horse. A parent signing for a minor is exempt from USEF nonmember fee. Art 1504.1. All must be adults or parent/guardian stated.
- 6) Amateurs and Juniors will be pinned together unless entries warrant.
- 7) **If your payment to KDA was returned for insufficient funds in the past, a certified check or money order is required for this year’s entry fee.**

BEFORE YOU SEAL YOUR ENTRY ENVELOPE

- Is your entry form signed on ALL THREE boxes on the back? The Trainer Box should be signed by the adult responsible for the horse on the show grounds. For JR/YR, this should be the parent's signature (or the accompanying adult). Actually, most of you were quite good about this last year. Keep up the good work!!

- Have you included a LEGIBLE copy of a current Coggins? The Coggins must be dated within the past 12 months from the date of the show. If the results or the date cannot be read on the copy, I'll be asking for another one.

- Have you included copies of current USEF/USDF cards? If the cards are not for the current competition year, please do not send them. To be registered in Adult Amateur classes, your card must note your amateur status. Both rider and owner must be a member of USEF and a participating member of USDF for ride in qualifying classes to count. Owner may be a USDF Business Member. **Also, your USEF card must denote Dres, CT, or Platinum. If it doesn't, you must pay the \$5 breed/discipline fee (Juniors are excluded from this).** There were some real problems with this one last year. If you have waited until now to renew your memberships or to join for the first time, it's already too late for your cards to arrive in time for the closing date and probably too late for them to arrive in time for the show. You will have to go by USEF and pick up your card or pay a \$5.00 affidavit fee.

- ☐ Have you included copies of your horse's USEF recording and USDF registration? If you're riding in qualifying classes, you must have these for your scores to count.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

BRIDLE NUMBERS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES ON THE SHOW GROUNDS. THIS INCLUDES NON-COMPETING HORSES.

Footing/Arena: Five sand arenas, 20m by 60m. Warmup will be available on sand and on the track. Lunging on the track only.

Veterinarian: Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital on call. Number will be posted at Hospitality stall and in secretary's office.

Farrier: Steve Koch, 859-621-4529. On Grounds: Wednesday and Saturday, other days on call. Number will also be posted at Hospitality stall and in secretary's office.

KDA: The Kentucky Dressage Association is a nonprofit organization established to encourage participation and education in dressage. We sponsor competitions, clinics, symposiums and a newsletter with special consideration for our members. We have an extensive awards program, an incentive for horse and rider to compete and improve. Each KDA membership includes a group membership to the USDF, entitling member to USDF mailings, and other benefits. See www.USDF.org for more information.

Directions: The Kentucky Horse Park is located on Iron Works Parkway, north of Lexington. From I-75, take Exit 120. From other highways, watch for Kentucky Horse Park signs. Enter main gate entrance of the park, watch for signs to KDA stabling (or ask for directions from the gate attendant). Incoming trailers will be admitted first time only without a pass. When you arrive at the park, the Kentucky Horse Park charges a \$5.00 fee for a KDA Show Pass, which is good for all the days you are there for the shows.

The USEF strongly encourages all riders to wear protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the competition grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the USEF, Show Committees, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. (Art. 318.5)

Class Explanations:

Adult Amateur: For Dressage, an Adult Amateur is 22 years of age or older. AA cards are available from USEF at no charge to members. AA entrants must mail a copy of their card with entry form or fill out affidavit of application at the show.

Open or Adult Amateur: These classes will be split into Open and Adult Amateur if there is a minimum of 4 entrants for each class. If entering as AA, note it on entry form. **If sufficient JR/YR entries, they will also be split into separate class.**

Junior Rider: An individual who has not reached his 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. The age of an individual on December 1st will be maintained throughout the entire competition year. Persons born on December 1st assume the greater age on that date. If a competition is in progress on any November 30th, junior status at the start of the competition will be maintained throughout that competition. (Except Combined Training/Eventing and Dressage Competitions, see Arts. 1704.4.2 and 1919.3). (USEF Art 115).

Young Rider: Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. (USEF Art 120)

Qualifying Classes (GrAmerQual) will not require a separate ride. An exhibitor wishing to qualify will enter the appropriate test as Open, Amateur, or Junior/Young Rider and pay an additional \$10.00 fee to have the ride recorded as a qualifying ride. Exhibitors entering Great American Qualifying Classes must provide the show secretary with proof of membership and registration in USEF and USDF for horse, rider, owner, (and trainer and coach when applicable). Trainers and coaches do not need USEF or USDF membership for qualifying rides.

“EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.” USEF Art. 1402.1

Awards: First place award and six ribbons for each class. Champion and Reserve ribbons and prizes at each level. When classes are posted you may pick up your ribbons and prize money. President's Cup: KDA member in good standing at time of show with highest percentage ride at any USEF/FEI level. Management reserves the right to make any changes required by circumstances. No separate awards for qualifying classes. Thoroughbred Weighted Percentage Class rides to be ridden at the highest test in each level. Horses eligible must have TB papers, or a lip tattoo. Born in the USA Breeders Award- These five awards will be presented to the highest scoring horses who were CONCEIVED AND FOALED in the USA showing the following categories: Fillies (from 2008, yrl, 2yr. old, 3 yr. olds), Colts/Geldings (from 2008, yrl, 2yr. olds, 3yr. olds), Mares and Stallions, and Materiale Classes.

Cash Prizes given in classes are designated by dollar signs. Prize money for (\$\$\$) will be divided by 1st-\$40, 2nd-\$30, 3rd-\$20, 4th-\$10. Prize money for (\$\$\$*) will be divided 1st-\$200, 2nd-\$150, 3rd-\$100, 4th-\$50. Prize money for (\$\$\$\$) will be divided 1st-\$300, 2nd-\$180, 3rd-\$160, 4th-\$140, 5th-\$120, 6th-\$100. Born in the USA \$500 will be divided \$100 to each highest scoring filly, colt, mare, stallion and Materiale horse.

Musical Freestyles: A player will be available for music – cassettes or CDs. Sound tests will be done at 7:30 am Friday in Dressage Complex. To enter Freestyle class, except for USEF/USDF championships and for FEI freestyles “at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum of 58% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of higher level at an USEF recognized show. Riders must submit a photocopy of the test verifying their eligibility with their entry to the freestyle class”.

Dressage Judge Evaluation Forms: Both the USEF and the USDF strongly encourage competitors to take the few minutes necessary to complete the Dressage Judge Evaluation forms that will be provided to you. Completion of these forms is beneficial to all of us.

Competitors' Party: There will be a Freesytyle Gala/Competitors' Party. Please see the KDA website, www.kentuckydressageassociation.org and the Program for details.

Kentucky Horse Park Rules:

1. All Exhibitors must pay a \$5.00 for a KDA Show Pass for entry into the park for your vehicle. The Guard at the booth will issue your weekend pass.
2. Exhibitors/competitors/spectators must park within designated areas only. The Horse Park will ask you to move your trailer if you park in the grass.
3. Horses and horse-drawn vehicles have the right-of-way at all times in all areas.
4. Exhibitors must present exhibitor passes before entering stable and/or show areas.
5. Vehicles permitted in stable area for loading and unloading purposes only.
6. Exhibitors' special requests and/or problems must be relayed to show management and not directed to Park personnel. All Park personnel will respond to emergencies promptly.
7. Use of state property and equipment is not permitted by exhibitors or show management.
8. Show management must assume responsibility for damage to Park property by exhibitors participating in their event.
9. A Park admission ticket is required to tour the Park. Tickets may be purchased at the Visitors Information Center.
10. Golf carts/mopeds, etc. are a privilege - *not a right* - extended to show participants. **Drivers must be at least 16 years of age with a valid drivers license and are not allowed in the tourist/visitor areas of the park.**
11. All dogs must be on a leash, not exceeding six feet in length, at all times. Loose dogs will be removed by the Urban-County Humane Society.

KENTUCKY HORSE PARK REGULATIONS

1. ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

In compliance with the State of Kentucky Fire Code, the Kentucky Horse Park will no longer allow any of the following in stalls, barns or tents:

- a) any 2 prong plug appliances (fans, etc.)
- b) any 2 prong plug extension cords
- c) light duty cords for indoor use
- d) any 3-way adaptors unless specifically for outdoor use
- e) any adaptors without 3 prong connections

Any equipment not in compliance is subject to confiscation.

2. NO ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES (ATV) ARE ALLOWED ON HORSE PARK GROUNDS.

3. GOLF CARTS

- a) Exhibitors wishing to bring their private golf carts onto Kentucky Horse Park property must purchase a **Golf Cart License**. This license can be obtained at Devers Show Services for \$25 per show or \$50 for the season.
- b) All drivers must be at least 16 years old with a valid driver's license.
- c) Golf carts are strictly prohibited in any tourist areas of the park.
- d) Golf carts must obey all traffic laws & posted speed limits.
- e) Golf carts can be rented through Devers Show Services (859-233-9702).

The 2008 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed specifically to recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. Dover Medal Class Winner

The eligible rider with the highest score of 58% or better in the designated Second Level Test Three Class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Adult Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover pewter medal and neck ribbon. **Note: new for the 2008 USDF competition year the rider must ride Second Level Test Three.** Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery Gift Certificate for each of the first three USDF/Dover Adult Medals they win during the 2008 competition season.

2. The USDF/Dover National Merit Award

A USDF/Dover National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Medals in the same competition year.

3. Year End Awards

The USDF/Dover Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined by the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The Champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and a Jaguar dressage saddle. The Reserve Champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and a Jaguar dressage bridle.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF group, participating, or intercollegiate/interscholastic member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must ride Second Level Test Three.
3. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR808 of the USEF rules and be registered with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program; 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

WARNING

Under Kentucky law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risk of injury of participation in farm animal activities. There are inherent risks of injury that you voluntarily accept if you participate in farm animal activities.

Liability:

Neither the Organizing Committee, the Kentucky Horse Park, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Kentucky Dressage Association, USEF, or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators.

“Every entry at a recognized competition shall constitute an agreement and an affirmation that all participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler, and the horse), for themselves, their representatives, employees, and agents: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the association and the local rules of the competition; (2) represents that every horse, rider, drive, and handler is eligible as entered; (3) agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of the USEF and of the competition and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition, the USEF and/or their official , directors, and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, they authorize the USEF and/or the competition management to market, transfer, assign, or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, audiotapes or videotapes taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to, or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the event, sport, or the USEF, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status or endorses a specific product or service, and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claims to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and (5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold the USEF, the competition, and their officials, directors, employees, and agents harmless from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competitions, whether or not such a claim, injury, or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of the said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the USEF or competition. The construction and application of USEF rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the USEF must be file in New York State. See Article 1502.5.”

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
